13.02.2006	Campaigning at KCLSU	<p><b>Introduction</b></p> <p>The reason KCLSU exists is to improve the student life experience; hence our mission statement <i>student life support</i>. The primary means by which this is done is through representation and this should be of as high a quality as possible.</p> <p>Quality representation should exist within four main streams:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• individual - advocacy and advice;</li> <li>• course and programme - course reps, student staff liaison;</li> <li>• university wide - assessment, personal tutors, facilities, committee meetings; and</li> <li>• external - visa charging, environmental issues, local politics, national politics.</li> </ul>

We represent student interests in order that we might bring about change for the better, to support and improve their student life experience.

Of the above four streams, the following may be said to be true of KCLSU:

- Individual representation is of a good standard as our Democratic Services Department expands.
- Course and programme representation is in existence and while improvement is needed this is now on the College agenda.
- University wide representation is of a good standard and becomes more effective as our relationship with the College develops.
- External representation exists through the co-ordination of ULU and the NUS. While the success of this may be questioned, there are again movements to improve this. It does however lack somewhat in terms of our engagement in local politics/issues within London.

#### **What is campaigning?**

A campaign is a “course of action...either in having a distinct period of activity, or in being of the nature of a struggle, or of an organized attempt aiming at a definite result” (OED), resulting from identifying a need for change.

Campaigning is therefore a tool to be employed in achieving our strategic aims, to bring about positive change. As such, we must let go of the need to ‘campaign’ or ‘run’ campaigns for their own sake, and the belief that campaigning should fall under one person’s remit.

#### **What is campaigning at KCLSU?**

Promoting our elections or pursuing a more effective course rep system is not seen as a campaign. We have come to see ‘campaigning’ as an end in itself, a stand alone activity that must be done because that’s what students’ unions do. We fail to see that an integral part of our every day work of representing is in fact campaigning, of one form or another.

This is not to say that KCLSU does not have a role as leader when it comes to campaigning; that role should be identified by way of strategic planning and through the trustees. Rather, it is what we believe campaigning to be and the way in which we undertake activity relating to it that needs to change.

For example, our main election in March is dependent upon the involvement of each department, is a vital

element of our strategic planning, and is therefore embedded in the culture of KCLSU. There is no better example of the level of successful campaigning that is possible when everyone is involved and aware of the need for it.

### **The situation as it stands**

We recognise there to be different types of campaigns:

- 'Level 1'  
The priority campaigns of the officers. Usually academic/funding/College-wide issues and often behind the scenes carried out in meetings and in negotiation with the College.
- 'Level 2'  
Those campaigns run by KCLSU that are more visible, such as 'Wear it Pink' and 'Healthy Living'.
- 'Level 3'  
Entirely student led but supported by KCLSU, such as 'StopAIDS'.

KCLSU should be facilitating and supporting student activity around the issues that interest students. One indicator of what these issues are is the desire to set up a society or campaigning group. The concerns of students, demonstrated in such ways, should become the concerns of the organisation and a focus for staff support and resources, rather than those issues we think students either do or should care about.

In this way the campaigns of the student groups become the campaigns of KCLSU rather than the other way around. This does not mean KCLSU takes ownership of the activity but acts as more of a silent partner, providing support and resources.

### **What have we learnt from the year 2005-6 so far?**

1. Established practice is for the elected officers to pick 3 priority campaigns.
  - 1.1. These were decided too late.
  - 1.2. These have been neglected in the face of planning 'visible' campaigns.
2. The 'visible' campaigns (level 2) are rather arbitrary with little thought behind why we chose them other than 'because they're a good cause' or 'it's good for students'.
3. We feel a need to cater for many 'national weeks', religious holidays and remembrance days.

4. We try to do too much and end up doing nothing well.
5. What we do choose to do is left too late to plan and run well.
6. Department in-put is fragmented and as such what is run is not cohesive or as effective as it could be and is not 'owned' by all aspects of KCLSU. There is no sense of ownership.
7. We are able to support student groups such as StopAIDS well but this has not been formalised to easily extend to other, similar groups.
8. We have trouble raising interest in and enthusiasm for 'KCLSU' campaigns amongst students, as opposed to activity undertaken by student groups.
9. Students participating in campaigns is essentially a student activity or some sort of volunteering yet there is little co-ordination between these groups and the Membership Services department.

**Conclusion: the future of campaigning at KCLSU**

- Officers and staff identify priority targets for change for the forthcoming year in line with KCLSU's medium to long term strategy and determine how these changes will come about.
- These priorities and plans are incorporated into the strategic plan and disseminated through department plans as necessary. In this way, they are not just officer priorities but KCLSU priorities.
- KCLSU will not run 'Level 2' campaigns such as 'breast cancer awareness' or 'healthy living' that are also run nationally unless they are specifically highlighted as a priority in our strategic plan or by the trustees as responding to a direct need of students.
- KCLSU will support such campaigns run by other students' unions and ULU by means of displaying their events but will not partake in them unless satisfying the above conditions.
- KCLSU will identify *existing* groups of students who are organised, active and working for a specific cause (e.g. Amnesty International Society, People and Planet Society, KCL StopAIDS) and support their work in the same way that the Membership Services department support clubs, societies and student-led volunteering projects.
- KCLSU will identify new groups of students wishing to campaign on an issue and offer support.
- The basis on which campaigning groups will be allowed to be set up will be determined by policy and administered by the Membership Services department.
- Support for student campaigning groups will be provided by the Membership Services department.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• KCLSU will continue to react to emergency events, indicated when a group such as the Disasters Emergency Committee launch a campaign, or when the College indicates an emergency awareness programme for students such as a mumps outbreak.</li></ul> <p>It is by this approach to campaigning at KCLSU that the student led events that we have seen to be so successful (Multicultural Mela) can become more frequent, encourage more participation and be a real conduit for student activity, thereby fulfilling our aims as KCLSU.</p>

To alter the Constitution

1. In accordance with clause 16 of the Constitution of KCLSU:

1.1 That the current wording of sub-clause 9(i) of clause 9 of the Constitution of KCLSU be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“(i) Until 31 July 2006 the Executive Committee shall be composed of not more than six sabbatical officers and not more than thirteen non-sabbatical officers in accordance with the Regulations.”

1.2 That the following be included as a new sub-clause 9(ii) to clause 9 of the Constitution of KCLSU:

“(ii) In respect of elections for members of the Executive Committee held during the Spring Semester 2006:

(a) the following shall be elected to be the members of the Executive Committee in accordance with Regulation H with effect from 1 August 2006 (and for the avoidance of doubt sub-clause (i) above shall not apply):

Four paid full time Sabbatical Trustees;

and

Four unpaid part time Student Trustees.

(b) the portfolios set out in Regulation D shall not apply and the Executive Committee elected during the Spring Semester 2006 shall have the following portfolios:

- President
- Vice President Representation
- Vice President Participation and Development
- Vice President Communications

1.3 That the remaining sub-clauses of clause 9 be re-numbered accordingly.

1.4 That the following be inserted as a new clause 19 of the Constitution of KCLSU:

“19. INCORPORATION

19.1 The Student Representative Council may pass a resolution by a two-thirds majority to authorise the Executive Committee to transfer the entire assets and undertaking of the Union (subject to its liabilities) to a limited company established for exclusively charitable purposes having similar objects to those of the Union and of which members of the Union will be entitled to be members.

19.2 If a resolution is passed pursuant to clause
