Liberation Networks are student communities who exist to **connect us, highlight current issues and empower us to act collectively to bring about change and make a difference.**

Each Liberation Network is made up of:

- An elected Network Officer
- A team of Network Organisers
- All students at King's who self-define into the community
- Relevant campaign groups
- Affiliated student activity groups and societies

These Networks work collaboratively to **combat oppression, discrimination and inequality** faced by students on a local and national level through communication, empowerment and campaigning.

Liberation Networks at KCLSU aim to be intersectional. This means that they recognise the intersections (or overlaps) between different identities and the knock-on effects. **It's possible to self-define into one, some, or all of the Liberation Networks.** As a result, Networks often work together to achieve the best results.



Who are our Network Officers and Organisers?

Each Network has an Officer, and a number of Network Organisers to help run the Network. Every Network Officer sits on the Welfare Forum for the KCLSU Union Development Committees and makes decisions on student ideas that are submitted to change the union. Our Network Officers also work with the Student Officer team to create change at a college level, as well as representing KCLSU at NUS Liberation Conferences.

Alongside the Network Officers are up to five Network Organiser positions; a Treasurer, 2x Heads of Events and 2x Heads of Communications. Collectively, these Officers and Network Organisers will work alongside student members and affiliated groups to help deliver the work of the Liberation Network.



What will you be doing as a Network Organiser?

As a Network Organiser, you will help carry out the core functions that enable the Network to operate successfully throughout the year. You will be passionate about liberation work at KCLSU and building communities for your liberation identity(s).

- You will work alongside the Network Officer, affiliated student activity groups & societies, campaign groups and fellow students to help the Network function successfully.
- You are supported by the Liberation Coordinator and KCLSU Staff to help create positive change for students within your community.
- You will be organising events for your Liberation History Months that are relevant to your liberation identity including Black History Month, Women's History Month, LGBT+ History Month and Disabled History Month.
- You will have access to the annual budget of the Network to run events, campaigns and socials.
- You will work with a team of volunteers who will assist you in carrying out your tasks over the year.

What will you gain?

- Tangible and useful experience that will take you beyond your time at King's.
- Training and amazing opportunities to network and develop your CV.
- Become a core member of these incredible student communities; you'll meet new people, make new friends and make a real difference.

Current part-time, voluntary vacancies

Treasurer

This role is ideal for someone who feels comfortable keeping track of expenditure and working with numbers. This role will help you develop analytical and financial skills and an ability to maintain budgets.

Core duties:

- Responsible for the managing of the Network's finances.
- Maintain accurate written accounts of the Network's finances
- Present a monthly financial report to the Network Officer and Organisers
- Attend training to understand how to use relevant financial software
- Provide financial analysis and advice regarding allocation of Network budget

Head of events (2x role available)

This role is ideal for someone who's into organising events and socials. You will be comfortable talking to people and you will have an excellent eye for detail. **This role will help you develop project management skills and organisational abilities.**

Core duties:

- Responsible for the delivery of Network events for the year
- Organise events for Liberation History Months relevant to your liberation identity
- Organise the official Welcome social and termly socials going forward
- Delivering regular Network engagements for the year
- Oversee and facilitate collaboration events between affiliated student activity groups & societies and campaign groups
- Recruit a team of volunteers during Welcome Fair

Head of Communications (2x roles available)

This role is ideal for someone who feels comfortable using online platforms (including social media) as communication tools. You will be a confident communicator and having some level of creative flair will be a bonus! **This role will help you develop copy writing skills and build your marketing and digital skills.**

Core duties:

- Responsible for the maintenance and overseeing of the Network's social media and kclsu.org website page
- Updating the Network website page regularly with fresh content
- Creating regular Network newsletters for the mailing list and adding webpage news stories
- Promoting Network events and campaigns online and on campus
- Working with KCLSU media (ROAR, KCL Radio etc.) to raise the profile of Network on campus
- Recruit a team of volunteers during Welcome Fair
