1. We must resist privatisation in all its forms, from academies to universities to the NHS.

Conference resolves:

1. That the NUS is committed to the nationalisation of the biggest businesses, including banks, utilities, construction companies, education services, and healthcare, so that a socialist, democratic plan of production can run the economy for need, not profit.
