

Things I've been up to:

Conducting a financial review into SAGs funding: I am currently conducting a review into how societies and student groups are funded. I am also looking into ways KCLSU can finance societies in a sustainable way. More information regarding this will be revealed soon once the review has ended.

Wednesday afternoons: I have submitted, and will be presenting a paper to the Senior Management Team (SMT) of the university regarding the lack of transparency of the current free Wednesday afternoons policy. Currently, students who partake in recreational activities and both competitive and non-competitive sports are unable to fully participate due to the lack of flexibility within the policy. Hopefully, this will lead to having negotiations with Timetabling Services, to help rectify this worrying situation for students who partake in sporting commitments.

Supporting liberation groups and campaigns: Since beginning my term, I have kept my promise by consistently providing support for liberation campaigns and groups/societies, both pastoral and practical. I made sure that events during liberation months were promoted properly through KCLSU media channels, and providing societies with the necessary guidance they required. I have also organised events and workshops during these months, and will continue to do so through out the remaining liberation months.

The purpose of the guide is to provide a student perspective into KCL life, including input from students all across KCL – full of tips on settling in and starting university life.
